Hello All and Happy Happy February!

February 19th marks the 80th Anniversary of the Battle of Iwo Jima in the Pacific Theater of Operations during World War II. The battle which would become one of the most famous of the War, pitted 110,000 Allied troops, comprised mostly of the USMC V Amphibious Corps and the US Navy's 5th Fleet, against 21,000 troops of the Imperial Japanese Army. The battle would last six weeks and would be a decisive victory for the Allied forces in the Pacific. But victory would come at a cost as Allied Casualties outnumbered Japanese casualties at a rate of 3:2. On February 23rd, six Marines of VAC would become synonymous with the Battle of Iwo Jima as they raised the American Flag on Mount Suribachi. The photo of the event has become one of the most recognized of the war and was awarded the Pulitzer Prize the same year. Please take a moment to recognize the great sacrifice our Father's and Grandfather's made at Iwo Jima in February, 1945.

We hosted a pasta buffet on January 11th for the Quintin Browne Memorial Scholarship with a great turnout. Between the fundraiser and donations we were able to present a check for \$3757. Thanks to everyone who helped, donated and attended.

The SAL is in charge of the fish fry's this month, so I ask any member who is able to help, please do so. Prep will be on the Thursday's before and any help would be appreciated.
