### Hello all,

April 1st will mark the 80th Anniversary of the Battle of **Okinawa in the Pacific Theater of Operations during World** War II. Nicknamed "Operation Iceberg," it would be the largest amphibious landing and the last major battle in the Pacific Theater, pitting 250,000 Allied troops against 116,000 troops of the Imperial Japanese Army. The amphibious assault would be led by the Tenth Army, an amalgamation of four US Army infantry divisions and three Marine Corps divisions with support from US Navy Task Force 58 and Royal Navy Task Force 57. Okinawa was a must win for Allied forces as the war raged toward Japan itself. Victory would come 82 days later on June 22nd, but victory would come at a cost. Total allied casualties would be close to 85,000 including 15,000 dead. 375 tanks would be destroyed, 386 Navy ships damaged, 13 Destroyers sunk, 15 Amphibious Vehicles sunk and 8 other ships sunk. Okinawa would go down as the bloodiest battle in the Pacific. April 12th also marks the 80th Anniversary of the death of President Franklin Roosevelt. FDR led America out of the Great Depression and had been the beacon of leadership for the Allied Forces during World War II. Please take a moment to reflect on the sacrifices our Father's and Grandfather's made at Okinawa in April, 1945 and take a moment to remember the steady leadership of President Franklin Delano Roosevelt during the war.

Thanks to everyone who helped out at events this past month and thanks everyone for attending our Old Fashioned Fish Fry.

The SAL Old Fashioned Fish Fry will be on the 25th of this month and prep will be on the 24th at 6PM. I ask any SAL member who is able to make it to either, please do.

Features in West Salem will be hosting a Meat Raffle on April 6th from 1-3PM. Proceeds from the raffle will be donated to the Court of Honor pillar fund.
